2.2. Visualisation

Visual arts have a special place in the learning process. Jan Comenius, one of the first scientists to draw attention to the principle of visualization in education, emphasized that it is one of the most important tools in education. learning process. The importance of watching visuals was also emphasized by another Russian teacher, Ushinskij, who said that it is a tool that reveals the individual characteristics of students. Ushinskij emphasized that visualization makes learning easier, more specific, and more fun, thus avoiding the feeling of failure and fatigue (27).
