Everyone who travels, studies, governs, or sells rapidly learns that language may be a barrier to communication. The absence of a common language can significantly slow down or even stop development in any endeavor, including tourism, research, governance, policing, commerce, and data distribution. The term "common language" used here often refers to a foreign tongue, but in theory the same notion holds true for any interaction with foreign dialects or grammatical structures inside a single language. Along with its literal meaning, "They don't communicate the same language" it has a significant metaphorical significance. Although while these kinds of communication issues must occur hundreds of times every day, relatively few of them are ever made public. Publicity only occurs when a lack of communication leads to serious issues, including strikes, missed deadlines, legal issues, deadly accidents, or occasionally even war. One incidence of miscommunication that has been documented happened in 1970 when numerous Americans ate a particular toxic fungus. No cure was discovered, and two of the patients died within days. A chemist who was aware of a therapy that had been successfully utilized in 1959 and published in 1963 overheard a radio program on the case. Why, seven years later, had the American physicians not heard of it? Maybe because periodicals printed in European languages other than English were the only ones to publish the treatment's report. There have been several situations that are similar. Yet, isolated cases do not convey the scope of the issue; this information can only be obtained via studies of the use or avoidance of resources and interactions in foreign languages in various communication contexts. For instance, studies of the books and documents studied in libraries and other

information sources have revealed that relatively little foreign-language literature is ever consulted in the English-speaking scientific community. Just 13% of science and technology-related library requests were for journals published in languages other than English. The utilization of sources in other languages is sometimes found to be as low as 10%, according to studies of the sources referenced in publications. Businesses who want to sell their products abroad must confront the language barrier head-on. British industry, in particular, has come under fire in recent years for being linguistically exclusive, supposing that international customers will be content to converse with them in English and disregarding the importance of learning other languages. In the 1960s, almost two-thirds of British businesses dealing with non-English-speaking clients used English for outgoing letters, many used exclusively English in their sales brochures, and as many as 40% had no employees who could speak the clients' native tongues. Several English-speaking nations, including the USA, Australia, and New Zealand, were also found to have a similar issue. Yet non-English speaking nations were by no means spared, despite the fact that their use of English as a second language made them less susceptible to accusations of insularity. Since the 1960s, this issue has drawn criticism and public attention. Industrial training programs have encouraged a rise in language and cultural awareness, which appears to have significantly improved the situation. Nowadays, a lot of businesses provide their own translation services; as an illustration, in Britain, Rowntree Mackintosh currently publishes its documentation in six different languages (English, French, German, Dutch, Italian and Xhosa). To maintain uniformity when translating materials, some businesses offer part-time language classes in the languages of the nations in which they are most active. Some businesses create their own technical glossaries. It is now much easier to understand how neglecting to consider the customer's language demands might cause marketing activities to be delayed, harmed, or interrupted. The shifts in awareness have been most obvious in English-speaking countries, where the knowledge has gradually dawned that by no means everyone in the globe speaks English well enough to negotiate in it. This is a

particular issue in regions where English is not the primary language of government, such as the majority of the Far East, Russia, Eastern Europe, the Arab world, Latin America, and francophone Africa. Even though a foreign consumer speaks English pretty well, it is frequently neglected that they may not be able to comprehend it at the necessary level due to regional and social variations in speech that can seriously impair listening comprehension. It seems that communication between "we" and "them" is just as crucial to achieving understanding as communication between "them" and "us".

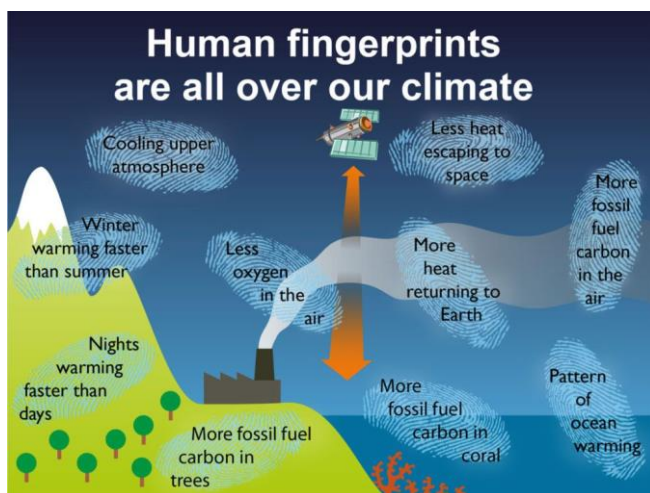

Many people believe that the changes that we have already made, observed in recent years and the changes expected to occur in the next 100 years are largely the result of human behavior rather than natural changes in the atmosphere. And that's very important about current climate trends; Never before has humans played such an important role in determining long-term weather patterns - we are entering the unknown and unprecedented for what might happen next

A. Many people may not consider themselves, at least an immediate reaction, to be "addicts," but a closer look at aspects of lifestyle and mental attitudes often reveals a very different picture. The main problem is that the traditional definition of the word has become blurred and the line between dependency and preference is much harder to define. In the past, the label "addict" was often applied to people with insatiable cravings for certain substances that are traditionally known to be harmful, illegal, or both: such as stimulant drugs. nerves, alcohol and nicotine. More recently, however, we are seeing a range of potential dependencies. Gambling, food, work, shopping - these are all potential areas where addiction can lurk.

B. When trying to identify the subject of addiction (and in many cases, subsequent treatment to better combat it), psychologists now often refer to three different types. The first involves forms of addiction that may not be life-threatening or particularly dangerous and are often labeled in an almost ironic way, such that the consumption of chocolate can lead to the creation of "chocolate addict". . This type is called soft dependency and is usually only associated with potential loss of productivity; In the workplace, an employee addicted to social networking sites can be a less helpful employee.

C. Drug addiction, however, is a completely different category and focuses on taking a drug (natural or synthetic) to temporarily change the chemical composition of the brain. It's a combination of physical and psychological dependence on substances known to be hazardous to health, and the related problem is that it often takes people who are addicted to drugs to get them, which leads to a very close link between drug abuse and delinquency.

D. Finally, behavioral addictions, which are considered “the compulsions to engage in a particular activity, despite adverse consequences” and are a relatively new entrant into the field recently. Also included in this grouping are concerns such as excessive gambling, and for many, the combination of internet availability and anonymity, along with the multitude of online gambling sites, has led to the sharp rise of this form of addiction.

E. When a mild addiction turns into a behavioral addiction, however, is both difficult to define and a source of considerable controversy. 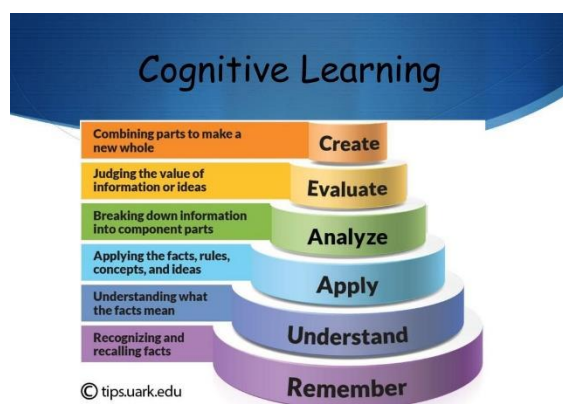
This made us realize that there are skill that students need to learn that are currently being overlooked. Education must strike a balance between the inner and outer emotional and practical aspects of personality and life.

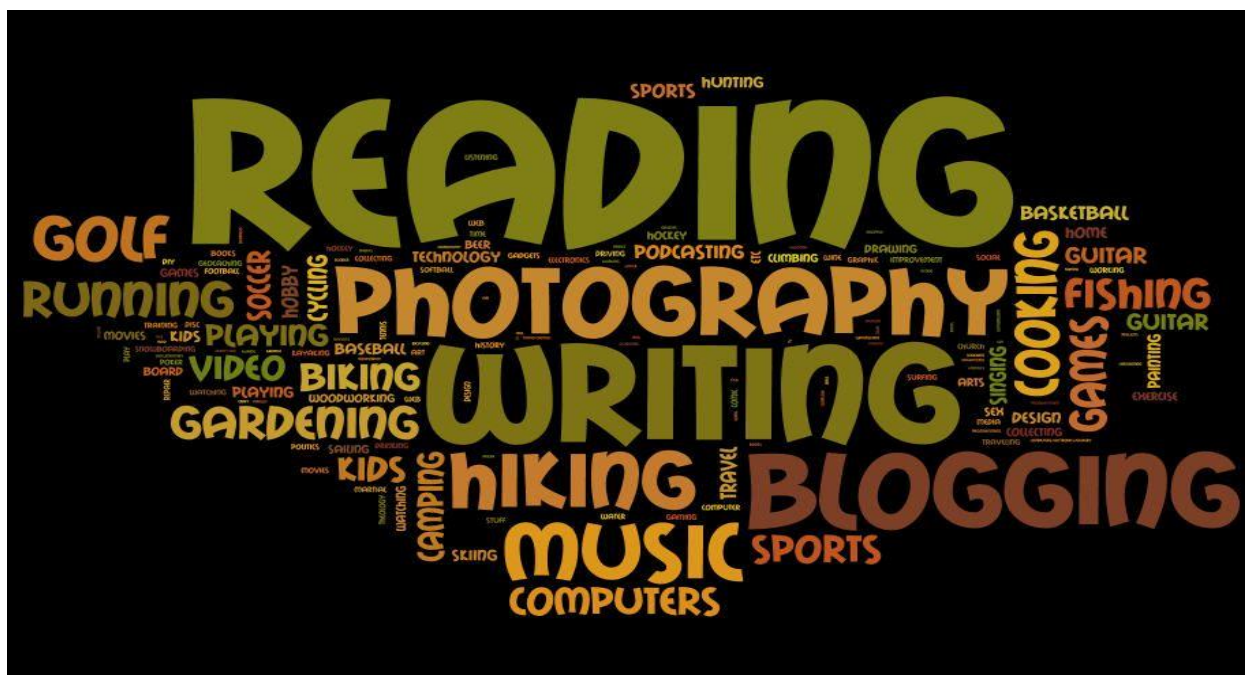

other experts say that what we are seeing is only part of a natural up and down swing. Flint has always been part of the global climate cycle. An analysis of the views of leading meteorologists in the United States found that less than 20% believe any change in temperature over the past hundred years is our fault - the rest say that these are natural cyclical changes.

It is undeniable that we are still at a very early stage in understanding weather. The effects of variables such as precipitation, cloud formation, seas and oceans, gases such as methane and ozone or even solar energy are not yet fully understood and therefore the predictions, we make Using them is not always reliable. Dr. James Hansen, in 19BH, predicted that the likely effects of global warming would be an increase in global temperature that would have disastrous consequences for humanity: "the relationship strong causality between the current climate and anthropogenic changes to the atmosphere". claims that using artificial climate models as a means of predicting change is virtually impossible. Global Issues

For many environmentalists, the world seems to be getting worse. They list our main fears: natural resources will run out, populations will continue to grow, less and less to eat, species will disappear in large numbers, and the planet's air and water will continue to grow. increasingly polluted.

But a quick look at reality shows a different picture. First, energy and other natural resources have become more abundant, not less, since the book "The Limits of Growth" was published in 1972 by a group of scientists. Second, more food is produced per capita on the planet than at any other time in history. Fewer people starve. Third, although species are indeed on the verge of extinction, only about 0.7% of them will become extinct in the next 50 years, not 25-50% as is commonly predicted. And finally, most forms of environmental pollution appear to have been exaggerated or transient - tied to the early stages of industrialization and therefore not the best solution. by constraining economic growth but by promoting it. One form of pollution - the release of greenhouse gases that causes global warming - seems to be a phenomenon that will persist long into our future, but its full impact is unlikely to be one. serious problem. A larger problem can become an inappropriate answer to the problem.

However, opinion polls show that many people believe that environmental standards are declining and that there are four factors that seem to be at the root of the disparity between perception and reality.

One is an inherent imbalance in scientific research. Science funding is mainly for problem areas. This can be a wise policy, but it will also make it seem like there are more potential problems than they really are.

Second, environmental groups need media attention. They also have to keep the cash flowing. Naturally, perhaps, they sometimes exaggerate their arguments. For example, in 1997, the World Wide Fund for Nature published a press release titled: "Two-thirds of the world's forests are permanently lost." The truth turned out to be close to 20%.

Although these groups are largely led by disinterested people, they still have many of the characteristics of other pressure groups. It would matter less if everyone applied the same level of skepticism to environmental lobbying as it does to pressure groups in other areas. For example, a business organization advocating weaker pollution control would immediately be considered interested. However, a green organization that opposes such impairment is considered altruistic, even

though an objective view of the controls in question may suggest they do more harm than coca.

The third source of confusion is the attitude of the media. People are more curious about bad news than good news. Newspapers and broadcasters are there to deliver what the public wants, but this can lead to significant distortions in perception. One example is the US encounter with El Niño in 1997 and 1998. This climate phenomenon is believed to have destroyed tourism, caused allergies, melted ski slopes and killed 22 people. However, according to an article in the Bulletin of the American Meteorological Association, the damage caused was estimated at US\$4 billion, but the benefits amounted to about US\$19 billion. These come from higher winter temperatures (which are estimated to have saved about 850 lives, reduced heating costs, and reduced spring flooding caused by meltwater).

The fourth factor is personal misperception. People worry that the constant increase in the number of things that people throw away will leave the world with no place to throw trash. However, even if the amount of US waste continues to grow as before, and even if the US population doubles by 2100, all the waste generated by the US during the 21st century will not only account for 1 /12,000 area. of the entire United States.

So, what about global warming? As we all know, carbon dioxide emissions cause global warming. The best estimate is that temperatures will rise by 2-3°C this century, causing serious problems at a total cost of \$5 trillion. clearly shows that drastic reductions in carbon dioxide emissions will be much more costly than paying the costs of adapting to rising temperatures. A model by one of the lead authors of the United Nations Climate Change Council showed that a projected temperature increases of 2.1 degrees by 2100 would only be reduced to a 1.9-degree increase. In other words, the increase in temperature the planet experienced in 2094 will be carried over to the year 2100.

So that doesn't stop global warming, it just buys the world six years. However, the cost of reducing carbon dioxide emissions, for the United States alone, will outweigh the cost of solving the world's most pressing health problem: providing

universal access to safe and hygienic drinking water. born. Such measures would avert 2 million deaths a year and prevent half a billion people from becoming seriously ill.

It is important that we consider the facts if we are to make the best possible decisions for the future. Excessive optimism can be costly, but excessive pessimism costs more.

Impact of the environment on children

- A. What determines a child's development? In fact, it would be impossible to explain every final influence that determines who becomes a child. What we can consider are some of the more obvious influences such as genetics, parents, experiences, friends, family relationships and school to help us understand the influences that contribute to development. development of a child.

- C. From the very first moments of life, the interaction between genetics and the environment helps shape who they are and what they will become. While the genetic instructions a child inherits from their parents can set a developmental path, the environment can affect how those instructions are expressed, shaped, or even immaculate. quiet. The complex interplay of nature and nurture doesn't just happen at certain times or over certain periods of time; it is persistent and lifelong
- D. Common environment (also called shared environment) refers to environmental influences that have the effect of causing siblings to become more alike. Shared environmental influences can include shared family experiences, shared peer groups, and the same school and community. Overall, there is no solid evidence for the general effects of the environment on many behaviors, especially those measured in adults. Possible reasons for this are discussed. Shared environmental effects are clearly seen in children and adolescents, but these effects generally diminish over the course of life. New developments in behavioral genetics methods have made it possible to identify important common environments and distinguish between familial and non-familial sources of shared environmental influences. He can also designate all siblings in a family, but the influence rate is less than 10%.

E. The importance of the non-shared environment has been hidden in quantitative genetic studies since they began almost a century ago. Quantitative genetic methods, such as twin and adoption methods, are designed to separate nature and nurture in order to explain family similarity. For almost all complex phenotypes, it turns out that the answer to the question of the origin of family similarity is intrinsic – everything that goes on in families is primarily for genetic reasons. However, the best available evidence for the importance of environmental influences comes from this same quantitative genetic study, as genetic influence never explains all the variance for phenotypes. complexity and residual variance must be attributed to environmental influences. Non-shared environment, can specify the proportion of siblings in a family, the influence ratio with children is 40% to 50%.



F. However, it took several decades for the full meaning of these discoveries to emerge. If genetics explains why siblings grow up in the same family, but environment matters, then surely prominent environmental influences do not cause siblings to look alike. That is, they must not be shared by children who grew up in the same household - they must be

"unshared". This implication of unshared environmental import was abandoned in the field of quantitative genetics because the focus of the field was then on the nature-nurture debate. In the nature-nurture debate, "nurture" is implicitly understood to mean a shared environment because, since Freud, theories of socialization have assumed that children's environments are distributed by family. On the other hand, the advantage of non-shared environments is that the environments are distributed per child. Note that the phrase "non-shared environment" is shorthand for a component of phenotypic variance - it refers to

"effect" and not "event", as discussed below. Research from recent years suggests that parental influence is easily disrupted by the influence of children of the same age. It also shows that differences in the knowledge that children absorb from other cultures are increasing. Balls are thought to have been first used around 2,500 years ago in China - although they were kicked instead of

ancient Greece some 2,000 years ago, as well as in China and Japan, and a version of the game was played by children all over Europe. Asia played since then. The goal is to keep hitting shuttle over and over again for as long as possible. However, the modern game we call badminton was developed in England, and it wasn't until the 19th century. British soldiers learned to play a game using badminton while serving in India. From in the mid-18th century. When they went home, they brought the game. At this point it was called Poona - named after a place in India – and from around 1860, it became popular in the UK. This is where the grid was first introduced in 1867 and the modern scoring system began to develop, despite disagreements over the rules of the game among players, and there is no official organization. this sport. All that changed in 1887. The name "badminton" was introduced after the famous party at a country house of the same name that year. At the party, a game was played that was very similar to the game we call badminton today. A modern set of rules, was drafted and published in 1893, and the British Badminton Association was established in 1895 to govern the new sport and organize championships. The first of these 55,555 competitions were held in 1899 and 1900, for men and women respectively. Badminton can be played by both men and women, although slightly different rules and the scoring system apply. The new sport quickly became very popular in the UK. In 1920, there were 300 badminton clubs in the whole country and this number had increased to 500 by 1930. At the same time, the sport also spread to other countries and in 1934, the International Badminton Federation (IBF) was established. The IBF decided to organize the international championship in 1939, but due to World War II, the first was only held in 1948, and then only for men. The first International Women's Championship was held in 1957. Badminton was first competed at the 1972 Olympics, but as a demonstration sport - there were no actual competitions or medal winners. Although it happened again in 1988, it wasn't until 1992 that badminton became a fully recognized Olympic sport - with the addition of mixed doubles in 1996. Badminton is now It is one of the most played sports in the world.

It's one of the fastest racquet sports, with balls traveling up to 260 miles per hour in the top competitions, so it's fun to watch and play.

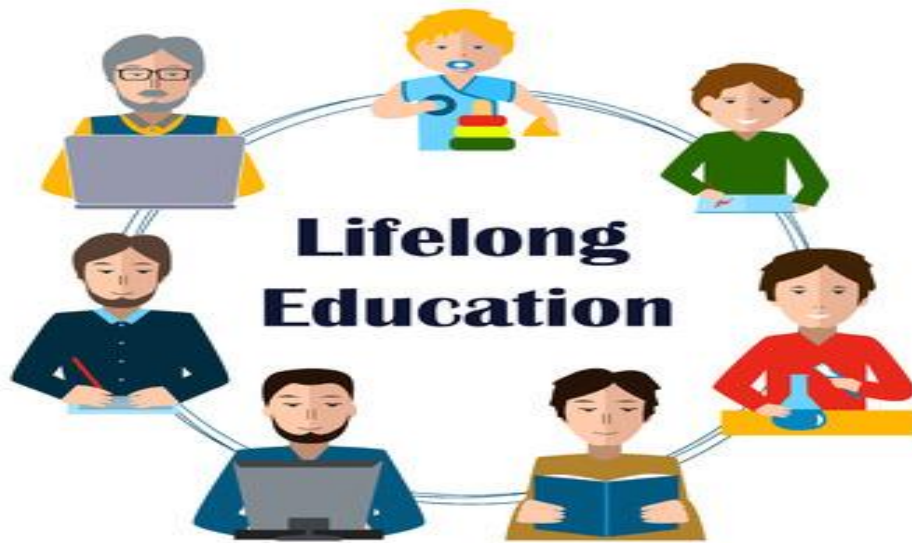

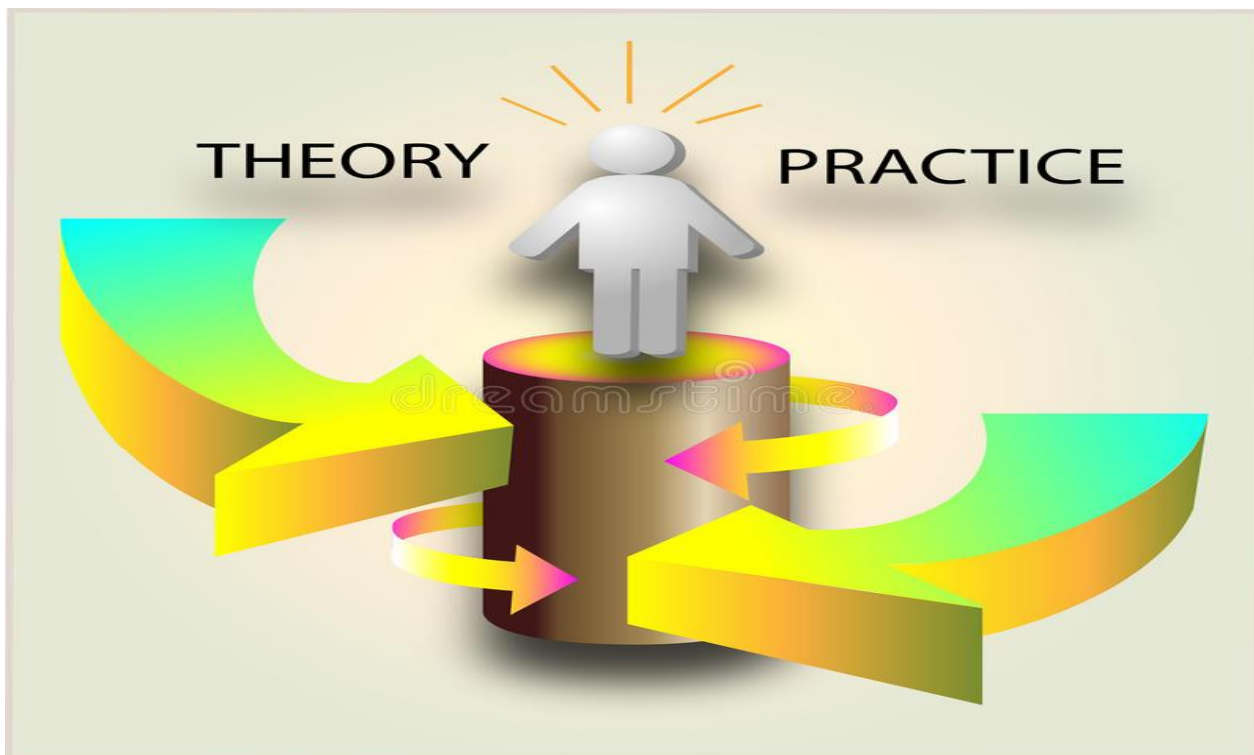

Theory or practice?

Students attend universities and other educational institutions to prepare for their future. We pay tuition and try to take courses in the hope of finding an interesting and satisfying career. But the choice of your university has a big impact on your future. How do you know which university will best prepare you for your future? Like other academic institutions, business schools are judged on the quality of research conducted by their faculties. Professors must teach students and create original research in their fields. The quality of this study was assessed by academic publications. At the same time, universities have another responsibility of equipping their students in the real, however defined, world. Most students who

learn from professors won't get into college on their own, so how do academics best prepare them for their future careers, whatever that may be? Whether university research actually produces something useful for business, or even whether that is its mission, are questions that can spark heated debates. floating on campus.

The debate, which first erupted in the 1950s, was rekindled in August, when AACSB International. The world's most widely recognized accrediting body for business schools, has announced that it will consider changing the way it evaluates research. The news followed some pretty disastrous criticism in 2002 from Jeffrey Pfeffer, a Stanford professor, and Christina Fong of the University of Washington, who questioned whether business education in its current form was possible. Research shows that traditional university models have not adequately prepared students for the kind of careers they face today. The most controversial recommendation in the AACSB's draft report (which has been sent to regulators for comment) is that faculties should be required to demonstrate the value of their faculty research not only by listing its citations in journals, but also by demonstrating its impact. in the professional world. New conditions, such as median income, student placement in top companies and business partnerships will now be considered as important as academic publications.

AACSB justifies its position by saying that it wants schools and teachers to play to their strengths, whether in pedagogy, in finding practical applications or in scientific endeavors learn. Traditionally, universities operate in a pyramidal structure. People come and stay with the goal of achieving success in their academic field. A psychology professor must publish competitive research in leading neuroscience journals. A professor of cultural studies must send doctoral students on a field research expedition to be taken seriously. This research is central to the production of a university. And research of any kind costs money – the AACSB points out that US business schools alone spend more than \$320 million a year on such research. Therefore, it seems reasonable to ask, for what purpose is it done?

If a school chooses to specialize in career outcomes rather than academic outcomes, they can use that money and redirect it to more successful programs. For example, if a business school wanted more staff present at top financial firms, that money could be spent on a career center focused on developing students' skill, instead for paying extra for high-level research done through faculty efforts. A change in assessment could also open the door to inviting more experts from different fields to teach as teaching assistants. Students can take courses recognized by those currently working in their dream field. The AACSB urges universities to answer the question of why research is the most important component of traditional education.

To some extent, the question is easy to answer. Research in business schools, as everywhere else, is to push the limits of knowledge; it thrives on answering unanswered questions. Certainly, this pursuit of knowledge remains important to the university system. Our society is progressing because we are learning to do things in new ways, a process that relies heavily on research and academia. But other obvious practical applications of research publications cannot be ignored. The study also aims to strengthen the reputation of schools and teachers. Schools receive awards for their department's publication record: which journals publish them and how often. In some cases, as with government-funded schools in the UK, this can affect the amount they receive. For teachers, the mantra is often "publish or perish." Their careers depend on being featured in the right magazines.

But at some point, you have to ask yourself whether this research is done for the benefit of the university or for the students the university is aiming to teach. Larger publications will attract more money, which in turn will be spent on better publications. Students seeking to enter careers outside of academia find this cycle frustrating and often see their professors as part of the "Tower" of the academy, operating in a closed community with so little influence. outside world.

Research is barely read by real-world managers. Part of the problem is that magazines operate under a similar philosophy. They publish more than 20,000 articles a year. Most of the research is highly quantitative, hypothesis-based, and

esoteric. As a result, real-world managers barely read it. The majority of studies critique another published research. An article in the journal *Strategy & Leadership* in 2006 stated that "research is not tailored to the needs of managers, nor is it communicated in the journals they read... For the most part, it has become a self-contained reference system [not related to] business performance." The AACSB requires that this distinction be changed for the future of higher education. If students invest thousands of dollars in education as part of their career path, academics serving students should be more fully integrated into the professional world. This means universities need to focus on strengths other than research, such as professional networks, technology skill and connections with top companies around the world. Although many universities have resisted the report, today's world continues to change. Universities that prepare students for our changing future have no choice but to adapt to new trends and new standards.

A bar at the folies (Un bar aux folies)

- A. A Bar at the Folies, a masterpiece of the modernist movement in the 19th century, is one of the most highly acclaimed paintings. Originally owned by Emmanuel Chabrier, a composer, it is now in the possession of The Courtauld Gallery in London, where it has become a favorite among visitors.
- B. The painting portrays a late-night scene in a Parisian nightclub in the 19th century. A barmaid stands behind her bar, wearing a black bodice with a frilly white neckline and a spray of flowers on her décolletage. She rests her hands on the bar and looks forlornly at a point just below the viewer without making direct eye contact. On the bar, there are several bottles of liquor and a bowl of oranges, but much of the activity in the room is reflected in a

mirror behind the barmaid. Through the mirror, we see an auditorium bustling with blurred figures and faces, including men in top hats, a woman using binoculars to observe the scene below her, another woman in long gloves, and even the feet of a trapeze artist performing acrobatic feats above his adoring crowd. In the foreground of the reflection, a man with a thick moustache talks to the barmaid.

- C. Although the painting's subject is a real barmaid who worked at the Folies-Bergère, an actual establishment in late nineteenth-century Paris, Manet did not attempt to capture every detail of the bar in his rendition. The painting was mostly completed in the painter's private studio, where the barmaid posed with various bottles, and then integrated with quick sketches the artist made at the Folies itself.
- D. However, what is even more perplexing than Manet's relaxed attention to detail is the relationship between the activity in the mirrored reflection and the unreflected foreground. Similar to Diego Velazquez's much earlier work *Las Meninas*, Manet uses the mirror to play with our perceptions of which details are true to life and which are not. As a result, the customer's stance is also altered. In the mirror, he should be blocked from view due to the barmaid's position, but Manet has repositioned him to the side
- E. Why did Manet resort to such trickery? Perhaps precisely for that reason: to portray two distinct emotions or states of mind. Manet appears to be expressing his comprehension of the contemporary workplace, a setting that – as he saw it – caused alienation, where employees felt disconnected from their authentic selves and had to adopt an artificial work persona. The reflection in the mirror shows the barmaid's work persona, busily serving a

customer. However, the frontal view reveals how the barmaid genuinely feels at work: hopeless, lost, and isolated.

F. Since its debut at the Paris Salon of 1882, art historians have written numerous books and articles debating the placement of the barmaid and customer in *A Bar at the Folies*. Some have even staged reenactments of the painting to determine if Manet's seemingly distorted perspective could have been accurate. However, while scholars are understandably interested in the painting's compositional puzzle, the average person is more likely to see the fundamental, more relatable story beneath. Presumably, this is how Manet intended it.

Oscars

1 Once annually, the crimson carpet is rolled out and the celebrities start to arrive in their luxury cars, adorned in their finest garments, decorated with gems lent from some of the most exclusive shops in the city and worth hundreds and thousands of dollars. It is the yearly awards ceremony of the Academy of Motion Pictures Arts and Scientists, more commonly known as "the Oscars." For 75 years now, Hollywood has recognized the best actors, actresses, directors, and writers with these awards, as well as others working behind the scenes in these films.

2 The initial Academy Awards were presented in 1927, although there was no ceremony that year. The first awards ceremony occurred in 1929, a ceremony that differed in many ways from the ones we see today. In early ceremonies, a feast was held for all participants and tickets cost only \$10. There were only 12 categories for prizes, today there are over 35. In those early years, few movies had soundtracks – the movies were just becoming the talkies. But perhaps the biggest difference between the first ceremony and the ceremonies of today is that the winners of the awards were announced in advance of the ceremony – there was no element of surprise at all. It was not until 1941 that the "sealed envelope" was introduced, with all the drama and suspense that entails. Today, the phrase "the envelope please" has become symbolic of all the tension and spectacle of the Oscars.

3 Presently, over 70 million individuals watch the Oscars ceremony each year, making it one of the most viewed programs on TV. The ceremony appeared on television for the first time in 1953 and 1966 was the first time it was seen in color. An enormous amount of work goes into the preparation of this, Hollywood's most important event, and perhaps for this reason, the ceremony has never been canceled – though it has been delayed three times. Once the Oscars were postponed for floods (1938), and twice they've been postponed due to assassinations or attempted assassinations (1968,1981).

4 Therefore, who are the major victors? The most renowned "best picture" is perhaps Ben Hur, which obtained 11 Academy Awards in 1959. The only other film to win this many Oscars was Titanic in 2000. The two movies share something else in common: they were both "high-budget" films, considered excessively extravagant by many critics. In fact, the expression "bigger than Ben Hur" has entered everyday English, to describe something enormous, with no expense spared. Titanic was created with a record budget of US\$200 million, although it still made a handsome profit at the box office. Another significant winner was the film Gone with the Wind, which won 8 awards in 1939. This was one of the longest movies (3 ½ hours) to win and is still considered a film classic.

5 The recipient of the Best Actress Award for *Gone with the Wind* was Vivien Leigh, a newcomer to the screen. She also won the Best Actress Award in 1951 for another film - *A Streetcar Named Desire*, the only other film for which she was nominated. Each year, five actors and five actresses are nominated for the Best Actor Award and the Best Actress Awards, and this in itself is a great honor. The actress to receive the most nominations is Meryl Streep, who has been nominated for 13 awards - and won two. Katherine Hepburn, however, is the actress to have won the most awards - she won four Best Actress awards in her lifetime.

6 Jack Nicholson is the only actor to win three Best Actor Awards, although Tom Hanks, Dustin Hoffman, and Robert De Niro have all won two. Of these four actors, all but De Niro seem to support the theory that an actor's chance of winning a Best Actor or Best Supporting Actor award is greater if he is portraying a physically or mentally handicapped person. And if the character dies during the movie, this seems to help as well.

7. In reality, there exist numerous factors that can impact the bestowment of accolades for actors and actresses, elements that may have little to do with their portrayal in a specific movie. Occasionally, prizes are conferred upon a performer for a film that is not particularly exceptional, in order to acknowledge a lifetime's contribution to the film industry. This was the case, for instance, when Paul Newman won for his part in *The Colour of Money* (1986). Furthermore, awards may be granted to correct previous injustices when it is believed that a performer should have won an award for a prior film. Henry Fonda, for example, won an award for his performance in *On Golden Pond* in 1981, which many felt he had deserved years earlier for his role in *The Grapes of Wrath* (1940). Another factor that may influence the Academy's selection is the "sympathy vote," such as Elizabeth Taylor's win for Best Actress in 1960 for *Butterfield 8* - just after an almost fatal bout of pneumonia.
