ABSTRACT

This article is devoted to the pragmatic analysis of the somatism "heart" in "Anna Karenina" by Leo Tolstoy. This article reveals contextual meanings of the "heart" in different utterances. The findings are supported with the direct examples from the literary work

Introduction.

'When a diplomat says yes, he means perhaps. When he says perhaps, he means no. When he says no, he is not a diplomat. When a lady says no, she means perhaps. When she says perhaps, she means yes. But when she says yes, she is no lady' quotes Alfred Danning.1 These statements about diplomats and ladies may or may not be true. They do, however, remind us that communication is a complicated process. The dialogue in which we are engrossed does not necessarily imply what it appears to mean. Due to the context, the statements can be interpreted in a variety of ways. Everyone understands the meanings of the terms 'yes,' 'no,' and 'maybe.' The speaker, on the other hand, use them in a contentious manner. As a result, a question arises: How is this even possible? The area which studies this process is pragmatics.

Material and methods.

The study of language is linguistics, and pragmatics is a subset of linguistics. A procedure in which the speaker makes a suggestion and the listener infers is known as conversational implicature. Pragmatics is a branch of philosophy that focuses on this process. Simply said, pragmatics is the study of non-verbal communication. Instead, the speaker alludes to or hints at a meaning, and the listener deduces the correct idea.

Pragmatics can be regarded of as a collective agreement among people to obey certain principles of interaction. In everyday conversation, the meanings of words and phrases are typically implied rather than explicitly stated. In some situations, words can have a special meaning. Although you may believe that all words have the same meaning, this is not always the case. The study of how words are used is known as pragmatics. [6, 44]

Phraseology is one of the most effective ways to expand and extend one's vocabulary. It is one of the most colorful part of the

vocabulary system, and it expresses this speaking community's unique perspective on the world. It reflects the nation's history, as well as the habits and traditions of the people who speak it. In the vocabulary system, phraseology is a distinct subsystem.

Phraseological units comprises onethird part of the colloquial speech. Therefore, they are used widely during communication. Being well-known as somatisms, which derived from Greek word meaning 'the body', are used in phraseological branches too. In this case, feelings, emotions, circumstances are compared to functions of parts of body metaphorically.

Being one of the most famous works of all time 'Anna Karenina' [1, 23] is still considered to be most read book of all time. It is also known for making use of somatisms effectively throughout the work. This paper focuses on the analysis of the somatism 'heart' in context which is directly connected with pragmatic analysis.

Results.

According to Cambridge dictionary [7, 73] the word "heart" means "the organ in your chest that sends the blood around your body":

• He could not touch the stock of his gun, it was so hot; his heart beats with short, rapid throbs [1, 1267].

However, the somatism "heart" can mean various portable meanings in different utterances. You can see additional colourful meanings of the word below:

Have a kind, unkind, cruel etc. character: you have neither heart nor honorable feeling! [page 27]. He's such a true, honest nature, and a heart of gold [1,131]. 'That only shows you have no heart,' she said [1,304]. Being a man of very warm heart, he was seldom angry [1, 424]. I wonder really that with your kind heart you don't feel this [1, 587]. She's a woman with a heart, before everything, but you'll see [1,1497]. You can't with your pure heart understand all [1,1384]. I feel that I have a heart, and that there is a great deal of good in me [1, 126]. 'How could you find out what sort of heart he has?' [1, 854]. He's good hearted, but he's proud, and now he's

so humiliated [1,149].

- 2. **the central part of place:** walking on low silky grass between old birch trees standing far apart, and went more into the heart of the wood [1, 1218].
- feeling of great sadness and pity: She did not want to talk of her sorrow, but with that sorrow in her heart she could not talk of outside matters [1, 145]. But, darling, I'm simply sorry, sorry from my heart for you!' [1, 146]. He knew that for this, for the very fact that his heart was torn with grief, they would be merciless to him [1, 1101]. Levin yielded with a sinking heart: yes, he drew it to his mouth and kissed it [1, 1077], they meant an inborn, almost physical, aptitude apart from brain and heart.. [1, 1035]. Her heart was broken [1, 262]. Kitty looked into his face, which was so close to her own, and long afterwards-for several years after-that look, full of love, to which he made no response, cut her to the heart with an agony of shame [1, 174], he has hurt you, pierced you to the heart[1, 150]. Kitty knew that the words she had uttered in anger about her husband's infidelity and her humiliating position had cut her poor sister to the heart, but that she had forgiven her [1, 274], not considering that by this he would be ruining her irrevocably, had sunk into his heart [1, 939].
- 4. **To put one's self at ease:** The first thing to do to set his heart at rest was to accomplish what he had come to Moscow for [1, 60]. Vronsky felt that his heart was at peace and he could hold his head up [1,667].
- 5. To use, accept, or take advantage of something quickly or enthusiastically: He knew she was there by the rapture and the terror that seized on his heart[1, 62].
- 6. **To fall in love or become switten with someone:** 'He has completely lost his heart to you,' she added[1, 1359]. I'm very fond of her, but she has a screw loose somewhere—has lost her heart to this Landau now, and nothing is settled now in her house [1, 1576]. The baby girl—HIS child—was so sweet, and had so won Anna's heart, since she was all that was left her, that Anna rarely thought of her son[1, 1008], servants Konstantin and

Ekaterina, and make their troth fast in faith, and union of hearts, and truth, and love [1, 986]. I speak plainly, at my age, and I tell you simply that I've lost my heart to you [1. 138]. 'My daughter has lost her heart to you,' she said [1, 477].

- 7. Feeling very sincerely towards smth/smby: Everything in this baby was charming, but for some reason all this did not go deep to her heart [1, 1170]. At the bottom of her heart rejoicing at the depth of his love for her, shown now in his jealousy[1, 1244]. As I have mentioned to you, there's a sort of coldness in him towards the most important questions which ought to touch the heart of every man and every child....' [1, 1124]. Vronsky's wound had been a dangerous one, though it did not touch the heart, and for several days he had lain between life and death [1, 942].
- 8. Feeling of different mixed emotions: 'Yes, there's such a chaos in your heart just now that you can't find anything there,' said Katavasov [1, 965], she pictured him, and felt how her heart was flooded with emotion and guilty delight at the thought of him [1, 323].
- 9. **used to say what someone is really like:** other people said she really was at heart the highly ethical being, living for nothing but the good of her fellow creatures, which she represented herself to be [1, 480].
- 10. To treat something as significant or i mportant and be moved, affected,influenceda t personal level: You know how she takes everything to heart [1,234].

11.

To share one's deepest or most intimate emot ions, thoughts, or secrets: Now that he had opened his heart, he became as he had been in the morning [1, 379].

12.To feel demoralized or pessimistic about s omething; to lose hope: 'If you can, lead the race; but don't lose heart till the last minute, even if you're behind' [1.427].

Conclusion.

So, in most literary works a writer transforms his inner experiences and perspectives on life, as well as his aesthetic experiences, through literary works. The words expressing parts of the body can be used effectively in literary works so as to enhance the style of the reading. Writers make use of words efficiently. In this article the author shows how Leo Tolstoy used somatism "heart" professionally.
