THE PROTECTION OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS IN UZBEKISTAN: RECENT DEVELOPMENTS, NEW DECREES, AND LAWS*

In recent years, Uzbekistan has undertaken significant efforts to enhance the protection of intellectual property (IP) rights. This article examines the key legal reforms, new decrees, and regulations introduced in the country to strengthen IP protection. The Uzbek government's commitment to aligning with international standards is evident in its adoption of modern laws governing copyright, trademarks, patents, and digital content. With a focus on the 2021 *Law on Intellectual Property*, the article discusses how new measures to combat piracy, strengthen the role of the State Intellectual Property Agency (SIPA), and improve digital content protection contribute to a more effective IP system. Despite the progress, challenges persist, particularly in digital environments, highlighting the need for continued reforms and stronger enforcement mechanisms.

New laws and regulations providing clear guidelines on how copyright, trademarks, patents, and related rights to be managed in Uzbekistan are discussed in the main part of the article. It also introduced stricter regulations on

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IP violations, establishing higher penalties for infringement and providing clearer procedures for registration and enforcement. In the discussion part the laws including provisions for the protection of creators' rights in various fields, including literature, music, software, and design are discussed. It ensures that creators can more effectively defend their rights, particularly in the age of the internet, where digital reproduction of content has become a major issue.
